These selections come from the Rider-Waite-Smith deck. If you use the Thoth deck or derivative, you will need to adjust the King/Knight/Page assignments for the Knight/Prince/Princess model used in that deck.

In general, the court cards in the “Advice” column can be read as “whom you should try to become or avoid becoming” in each focus area, depending on the nature of the three cards in the associated row and how they interact with the court card. If you use reversals, upright advice cards can suggest “become” and reversed cards “don't become,” but this should be factored into the detailed testimony of the other cards and not judged in and of itself.
